<u>Good News! Governor Murphy Signs New Law Requiring</u> <u>PBMs Disclose Spread Pricing in New Jersey</u>

Lays the Ground Work for Carving-Out PBMs from Medicaid



Governor Phil Murphy signed S249/A1259 into law which will require PBMs working in New Jersey's Medicaid program to disclose information on spread-pricing to the State.

The New Jersey Independent Community Pharmacy Coalition is laying the groundwork to carve-out PBMs

from the State Medicaid program. The law will provide the State with concrete evidence that PBMs are overcharging the Medicaid program, underpaying pharmacies and not sharing all of the negotiated savings with patients. This is the first step in carving-out PBMs from the State Medicaid program.

New York pharmacists, hit those phones today

The time is *now* to urge New York Gov. Kathy Hochul (D) to sign three pro-patient, pro-pharmacy bills that have been sitting on her desk for several months.

- S6603 (Skoufis)/A7598 (Gottfried): *Fee-for-Service Parity Bill*, a minimum payment floor and patient access protections.
- S3762 (Breslin)/A1396 (Gottfried): Registration and Licensure of Pharmacy Benefit Managers.
- S3566 (Breslin)/A5854A (Joyner): Anti-Mandatory Mail Order Reform Bill.

We urge all pharmacists and patients in New York to contact Hochul and tell her to sign the pharmacy rescue package now!
