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New York Creates New Framework for Regulating PBMs

New York State Governor Kathy Hochul delivered on landmark pharmacy benefit manager reform by signing two bills on New Year's Eve. After years of being permitted to operate with impunity in New York, pharmacy benefit managers (PBMs) will now have a legal duty and obligation in New York to act in the best interests of patients and the health plans that they administer. Governor Hochul proclaimed the laws "the most comprehensive regulatory framework in the country for Pharmacy Benefit Managers, increasing transparency for consumers and shedding light on the cost of prescription drugs."

Wall Street Journal: New York's Record Wave of Omicron-Variant Cases Sees Fewer Severe Ones

Fewer New York residents are seeing the worst outcomes of Covid-19 in its latest surge compared with earlier waves, a potential harbinger of what other highly vaccinated parts of the country will experience, health officials say.

- About 73% of all New York City residents are fully vaccinated, and about 27% have received an additional dose.
- Fully vaccinated patients are staying in the hospital for an average of four days, compared with almost two weeks for unvaccinated patients.
- Healthcare providers say there is a stark difference inside hospitals between people who are fully vaccinated and those who aren't.
